Ewing Y-DNA Project Update

As you may know, the Ewing Y-DNA Project has been transitioning away from the old 'STR' testing panels to the most comprehensive Y-DNA test available: The Big Y. This tests millions of locations¹ on the Y chromosome and reveals mutations called SNPs (single nucleotide polymorphisms).

These SNPs can, and have, identified specific Ewing Family Branch DNA markers. As an example, if you have the SNP BY18238, there is no doubt that Alexander Ewing of Nottingham, PA (1693-1752), and his father, James Ewing of Inch (1665-1707), are your ancestors.

Another example: If you have the SNP FT2973, we can be sure that you descend from Alexander Ewing of Ashford, CT (~1704-1782).


Just within the last 2-½ years, we have gone from having no specific Ewing markers, to now having not just the two examples above, but an additional 31 markers. This has only happened because 20 Ewings have joined Steve Ewing and Bill Ewing as the two original Big Y trail blazers.

The number of markers will grow at an increasing rate as new Big Y testers are added.

We hope that you will order the Big Y test kit, contribute, and take advantage of our new "The Brick Wall Project," which will be detailed in the November issue of the Ewing Family Journal. The Big Y results are the major components of this project. Further, we will announce the details of the other two pieces: Most Distant Known Ewing Ancestor and the atDNA Ancestor Project hosted at GedMatch.com in the next few weeks on social media

Did You Know . . . ?

Ewing sarcoma was named after <u>James R. Ewing</u>, an eminent American pathologist at Cornell who described the first cases in 1921.

Although he is best remembered for this singular achievement, Ewing's contributions to the study of cancer were far more profound and influential. He essentially launched oncology as a discipline with the publication of his seminal textbook and founded the major American cancer societies that exist today. His vision of comprehensive cancer centers still drives our research infrastructure. Since his initial report, these organizations have helped us achieve numerous milestones in understanding and treating patients with Ewing sarcoma.²

The Ewing tartan, woven by Lochcarron of Scotland is exquisitely made, and several EFA members have purchased many of the beautiful pieces listed below. It is unique and distinctive, reflecting our history and tradition. You may request pricing and place an order for cloth or ready-made garments via email from tartans@clanewing.uk.

Currently, all garments are made in 13oz Medium Weight 'Braeriach' tartan fabric; the pattern repeats every 6 1/4 inches or slightly more. Because the cloth is woven to double width, the amount needed for an 8 yard kilt is usually equivalent to 4 yards (3.7m). Be sure to ask your kilt maker before placing your order.
